

Exodus from Egypt – Review Worksheet

- 1.) List the reasons (excuses) that Moses gave for not being able to lead the Israelites out of Egypt as well as God's responses to them.
 - Who am I? (Exodus 3:11-12)
 - *I [God] will be with you. This shall be a sign...you shall serve God on this mountain.*
 - Who should I say has sent me? (Exodus 3:13-22)
 - *Tell them, "I AM has sent me."*
 - What if they do not believe me? (Exodus 4:1-9)
 - *God gave Moses the ability to do three miracles (rod to snake, leprosy, water to blood)*
 - I am slow of speech and slow of tongue (Exodus 4:10-12)
 - *I will be your mouth and I will teach you what to say.*
 - Please send someone else (Exodus 4:13-17)
 - *God became angry and told Moses that Aaron would accompany him.*

- 2.) Describe the covenant that God and the Israelites made at Mount Sinai. What was to be the responsibilities of each party in the covenant?
 - The Israelites were to become God's special people, His own possession (Exodus 19). They would become as God's children (Deuteronomy 32:6)
 - Israelites were to obey God's commandments (all the law)
 - The Israelites would be to God a kingdom of priests and a holy nation

- 3.) List everything that the Israelites (or specific people) complained about after they had left Egypt (up through Numbers 14) as well as God's responses to their complaints.
 - They complained in fear of the Egyptians' pursuit (Exodus 14:10ff)
 - God delivered them from the Egyptians via the Red Sea
 - They complained because they had no water (Exodus 15:22ff)
 - God made the bitter water become sweet
 - They complained because they had no food (Exodus 16:1ff)
 - God gave them manna to eat
 - They complained because they had no water (Exodus 17:1ff)
 - God gave them water from a rock
 - They complained that they did not know where Moses had gone and built an idol (Exodus 32)
 - God punished the people for their sin
 - They complained for an unknown reason (Numbers 11:1-3)
 - God killed some of the people
 - They complained for lack of meat (Numbers 11:4ff)
 - God gave them more meat than they could eat, then killed many of the people
 - Miriam and Aaron complained about Moses' authority (Numbers 12)
 - God struck Miriam with leprosy for seven days
 - They complained that they could not take the land (Numbers 13-14)
 - God punished them by forcing them to wander in the wilderness until the wicked generation had died, except for Joshua and Caleb (40 years total)
